This week Holly class have been very busy. We have written historical narratives based on a day in the Stone Age. We remembered lots of key facts from our inspiration day and included details using inverted commas for dialogue, expanded noun phrases and interesting descriptions of characters and settings. In Maths, we have counted in steps of 50 from any multiple of 50, both forwards and backwards and have shown great understanding of comparing and ordering numbers up to 1000.

In P.E, we used tricky footwork patterns like hop, side-step, gallop and skip. We have also hopscotched forwards and backwards, alternating our hopping leg each time. During Art sessions, we have explored watercolours and tried to replicate Pablo Picasso's paintings! PE Kit Reminder

Please can we remind you that on the day of your child's PE/Games lessons, they should have appropriate clothing and footwear at school ready to change into. This includes:

- House colour T-shirt (blue, green or red) with school badge.
- Navy blue shorts.
- Navy jogging bottoms for outdoor games in cold weather.
- Black pumps for indoor PE, black plain trainers for outdoor PE.

Also, for many reasons, including safety, we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are earring studs in pierced ears. However, children are required to remove these during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury. If for some reason they cannot be removed, they must be taped over.

Attendance- Parental Responsibilities

- Parents should avoid seeking permission from schools to take their children out of school during term time unless it is absolutely unavoidable.
- If a leave of absence is granted, it is for the headteacher to determine the length of the time.
- Requests for Leave of Absence should be made before any arrangements are confirmed or money committed
- The request form **MUST** be completed in advance by the parent(s)/ carer(s) before requests will be considered.
- If Leave of Absence is granted, please contact school to discuss measures to minimise the impact of the absence on your child's academic progress.
- A Leave of Absence form must be completed for each child.
- Parents may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice or prosecuted for unauthorised absence, including holidays.
- Children need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education.
