Welcome back to Kids Club!

We hope you had a lovely summer break. As we enter the Autumn Term, please can we ask for your support with the following;

-If someone other than the parent/carer are collecting your children, it is very important that the School Office are informed who will be collecting your child that evening. Alternatively, please ensure you have set a 'Collection Password' on your Kids Club Account which can be used to verify the person collecting the child. We cannot let children go home with anyone who does not have the Safe Word or without the parent/carers prior permission. Kids Club staff are prohibited from allowing children to be collected by anyone under the age of 18. This applies even if the School Office have been notified and if the individual knows the Collection Password.

-Secondly, if your child is booked into Kids Club but you are now collecting them at the end of the school day, please let Office staff know before 3pm or find a Kids Club staff member as they are collecting pupils. This saves Kids Club staff searching for children who have already gone home!

-If you know you will be delayed collecting your child (after 6pm), it is very important you inform Kids Club as soon as possible. Please do so by calling the Kids Club mobile on **07564 568005**. Please be aware that a Late Collection Fee of £5, +£1 per minute will be applied.

This term our craft/activities theme is 'Minecraft'. We would be very grateful if you could donate any unwanted cardboard boxes which will be used to create Minecraft characters and scenes. We would like boxes approximately the size of a cereal box or smaller. Please drop these off at Kids Club or give them to Kids Club staff on the playground.

Many thanks for your co-operation.

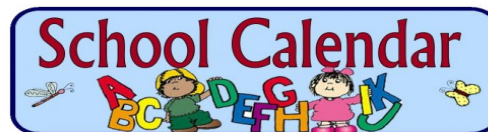

Leave of Absence – Advice from Warwickshire County Council

Parents do not have any entitlement to take their children on holiday during term time. Any application for leave must establish that there are exceptional circumstances and the Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. Headteachers will determine how many school days a child may be absent from school if the leave is granted.

The school can only consider applications for leave of absence which are made by the resident parent (the parent with whom the child normally resides).

Applications for leave of absence must be made in advance and failure to do so will result in the absence being recorded as "unauthorised". This may result in legal action against the parent, by way of a fixed penalty notice.

Applications for leave of absence which are made in advance and refused will result in the absence being recorded as "unauthorised". This may result in legal action against the parent, by way of a fixed penalty notice, if the child is absent from school during that period.

Important facts

Pupils attend school for 190 days each year. Over a school career:

1 day per week of absence =
Two and a half years of missed education

10 days per year of absence = Two terms of missed education

15 minutes of lateness per day = One year of missed education

Research by the Government shows that Key Stage 4 pupils with the lowest 5% of absence rates were more than four times more likely to achieve five good GCSEs, including English and Maths.
