

Primary Schools Girls Football League Competition

Well done to Budbrooke Girls for their performances during the Girls Football League event and for finishing joint 4th in the table.

The league event was played across 3 dates and saw 8 teams from the local area play each other at Myton School.

The competing teams included- The Priors, St Pauls, Ferncumbe, Long Itchington, Aylesford, Clapham Terrace and Kingsley.

In the first match against Long Itchington, Amelie, Faith and Flori made some advancing runs with the ball but the ball proved to move too quickly. Amelie then turned well on the half way line and passed to Flori to set up a chance that saw the goalkeeper make a good save. Anna was keen to make important tackles and blocked several Long Itchington attacks. Romy was confident and vocal in goal and made some wonderful saves. She also caught well and produced the biggest goal kicks of the night which set up chances for Budbrooke. Ella showed great resilience and Poppy battled for every ball. With the game looking set to end 0-0, Faith chased the ball and hassled the defender who was forced to play the ball back to the keeper. Faith was then on hand to knock the ball in and the team celebrated together what was a fantastic 1-0 win.

Budbrooke then came up against a very experienced and well organised St Paul's team. Budbrooke needed to defend and despite St Paul's scoring several goals early on, the girls kept on going. Romy again made lots of good saves to keep the score down, especially a great diving save that tipped the ball onto the post and earned lots of praise from the spectators.

Class Spotlight - Chestnut

Chestnut children performed a wonderful class assembly to showcase all their learning from the Invasion topic. They have continued to be very curious to learn interesting facts about the topic and have applied their understanding to write a play script about the events of the Norman invasion.

In English, they role played the events from the Battle of Hastings and wrote stage directions, scene descriptions and dialogue for actors to follow.

In maths, they have used arrays and bar models to solve multiplication and division problems as well as learning the relationship between the 3x, 6x and 9x table. They have also found the area of different shapes.

In science, the children have been learning about sound waves and how the ear works. They have used sound meters to investigate which materials would be most suited to sound reducing head phones.

In PE, the children have been working on their balance skills to improve and develop their core strength. They have also

been performing tuck jumps and squats.

School Games Speed Stacking Competition at Budbrooke

Budbrooke achieved great success in the School Games Year 3 Speed Stacking competition and will now get to represent Central Warwickshire in the County Finals.

The event, hosted at Budbrooke and attended by 8 teams from schools in the local area, was assisted by the Budbrooke Well Being Ambassadors who timed the events and offered support. The competition saw boys and girls from Holly class performing the 3 - 6 - 3 stack challenge as well as the relay event.

Each member of the teams had their times recorded which was then added together to find the total team time.

The Cup Stacking Super Stars will now head to the AT7 Centre to represent Central Warwickshire on 30th January 2024.
