

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Pupil Voice- Mental Health

What do you understand by the term 'mental health'?

Keeping your brain healthy, understanding different feelings and knowing what to do about them.

What can we do to look after our mental health?

Having a good night's sleep, exercise, drinking lots of water, talking to people, doing things we enjoy.

Why is it good to know your Early Warning Signs?

Early Warning Signs are there to help you to recognise when you're not feeling right. They remind you to do something about it

If you are having some early warning signs, what could you do?

Tell someone you know and trust - don't keep it to yourself.

Why do you think we have Worry Boxes at school?

When you have a worry, you can put it in the box and your teacher can read it and help you with it. If you don't want to say it out loud, you can write it down. They are good because you might not want to talk about it right away, but writing it down can help the worry to feel smaller.

- measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated
- measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain.
 Measles can kill
- your child is at risk of measles if he or she hasn't had the MMR vaccination
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection
- if your child is due to have had 2 doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible*
- if you can't remember if your child has had any, 1 or 2 doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP
- if you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have 2 doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected

*In response to a local outbreak then the 2 doses can be given one month apart from the age of 18 months









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
