Thursday 16th December	Carols at the church



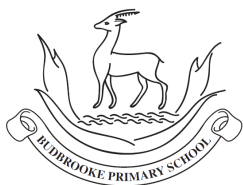

Bookings will go live at midday on Monday 11th November. should you have any problems accessing your school spider account please email admin2033@welearn365.com.

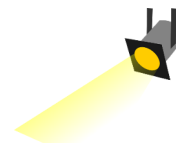
VACANCIES

CLASS SPOTLIGHT— BEECH



This week in English, we have performed our very own wind poems using actions, tone and expression. The children were confident, enjoyed performing and they all received a big round of applause. We have also started our instruction writing topic. To start, we read and followed a set of instructions to make an origami kite and have also looked at sequencing instructions using time conjunctions so they follow the correct order.

In Maths, we have used dienes and part whole models to help us add together 2 two-digit numbers. The children were able to confidently explain what they know about the numbers including whether they were odd or even and recognised the place value.

In Geography, we have located the equator on the map, looked at the different countries that the equator goes through and described what the weather is like.

In PE, the children have continued to develop their balancing skills, standing on one leg and performing squat balances and ankle thrusts. They have also created balance movements with a partner and performed them using mirror and reflection technique.
