

Parking - Please respect the safety of our pupils




Unfortunately the safety of our pupils has been compromised by cars parking outside the school gates on the yellow lines on the road that are located outside the green fencing at the front of our school. Parking restrictions outside schools are there to keep you and our pupils safe. Parking inconsiderately can put people in danger and you also risk being fined.

The safety of our pupils is paramount and we respectfully ask that you support this by not parking in this area. Actions that we have/ will be taking to ensure the safety of our pupils are:

- We have contacted the Highways agency to request the urgent remarking of the yellow lines outside our school so that the area is prominent
- Whilst we are waiting for this to be completed cones will be placed in this area to respectfully request that all drivers ensure the safety of our pupils by not parking in this area
- The local PCSO has been contacted to urgently attend the area

Spotlight form Beech Class



Beech Class children have shown curiosity and creativity in their learning so far this half term. In DT, as part of their Remarkable Recipes topic, the children have planned, made and evaluated a nutritious meal. They had great fun peeling and chopping

vegetables for the casserole and tasting it afterwards.

In English, the children have written fantastic poems based around the Pattan's Pumpkin text. We are enjoying this re-telling of a myth and can't wait to read more of the book.

The children have also celebrated Children in Need and explored how to safe in our Online Safety and PHSE Taking Care project.





Chestnut Class trip to St John's Museum

Chestnut Class visited St John's House this week to take part in an Anglo-Saxon day as part of their 'Invasion' topic.

The class' imagination was hooked by a story box that included the key words of significance, Anglo-Saxon facts, treasure and a planning application.

The themed day then saw Chestnut Class taking part in a council meeting, splitting into 5 groups – Farmers, Residents, Environmentalists, Builders and Shopkeepers - to debate whether Super Superstores should build a new supermarket on farm land that contained Anglo-Saxon artefacts and relics.

Each group used their super debating skills to put forward a series of well thought out points and respectfully listened to others arguments and views.

The children then looked at all the equipment that would be needed for an archaeological dig before viewing a selection of artefacts that had been found where the Anglo-Saxon settlement had been discovered, including a brooch, knives, spear heads, belts, necklaces and crystal stones. They then discussed what the items told us about the lives of Anglo-Saxon people and sorted the items into those that would have been owned by a cunning woman, a rich woman or a warrior.

Ancient pottery was then unearthed and the children were able to use their brushing and sketching skills to record what the items looked like and explained their significance.

In the end, the children in the role of archaeologists wrote acrostic poems to talk about the importance of history and then came back together to debate whether building a supermarket on Anglo-Saxon land would be beneficial to the local area.

"I enjoyed finding out about what Anglo-Saxon people wore and what was found in the grave site."

"I liked sorting the artefacts and finding out about the lives of Anglo-Saxon people."

"I liked the archaeological dig where we found pottery and looked at the patterns."

"I enjoyed the debating in the council meeting. I was able to give my thoughts and I grew in confidence."

Mr Brereton said: "Thank you to Warwickshire Heritage Learning for an excellent Anglo-Saxon Day. It was a great hands on experience and the children were able to showcase all their knowledge of the topic and use their excellent debating skills. Thank you to all the parent helpers for your help."

Dear Parents/Carers,

Year 3 and 4 children from Budbrooke Primary School have been invited to take part in the Hampton Magna Lantern Walk on Sunday, 1st December to celebrate the start of the Christmas season in the community.

In exchange for a Chocolate tombola donation, PTA volunteers will be in the school playground collecting that morning.


2nd December- Deadline for purchasing gifts for Santa's Grotto at the Christmas Fair.






The PTA want to try a new way of earning some extra cash with easyfundraising.


