PE Sports Premium



What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. **The grant for Budbrooke Primary School totals £9,000.**

Accountability

From September 2013, schools will be held to account over how they spend this additional, ring-fenced funding. Ofsted will strengthen the coverage of PE and sport within the 'Inspectors' handbook' and supporting guidance so that both schools and inspectors know how sport and PE will be assessed in future as part of the school's overall provision.

One year on, Ofsted will carry out a survey reporting on the first year's expenditure of additional funding and its impact. Schools will also be required to include details of their provision of PE and sport on their website, alongside details of their broader curriculum, so that parents can compare sports provision between schools, both within and beyond the school day.

At Budbrooke Primary School we believe that this additional funding provides us with a great opportunity to improve our provision for PE and sport even further.

We already provide many opportunities for participation in sport and PE within the curriculum, through clubs and in the competitions we enter in the local and wider areas.

Onside Coaching provide an extensive curriculum including multi-skills, team skills and endurance sessions across both Key Stage One and Two.

In Key Stage One children are taught to master basic movements including running, jumping, throwing and catching, as well as developing balance, agility and co-ordination. They participate in team games, where they can develop simple tactics for attacking and defending.

In Key Stage Two children are taught to apply and develop a broader range of skills, learning how to use them in different ways. They are taught the skills of communication, to collaborate and compete with each other. They

are also taught how to improve in different physical activities and sports and learn how to evaluate and recognise their own success.

At Budbrooke we also pride ourselves in the high number of extra-curricular sporting activities available for the children. These include:

- Multi-Sports (KS1)
- Cheerleading (KS2)
- Rounders (Yr 3/4)
- Football (Yr 3/4 & 5/6)
- Cricket (Yr 5/6)
- Table Tennis (Yr 3/4)
- Judo (Yr 4/5/6)
- Cross Country (Yr 5/6)
- Netball (5/6)

How will we be spending the Sports Funding?

<p><u>Swimming</u></p> <p>It is part of the National Curriculum and before children leave our school it is expected that they are able to swim. At Budbrooke, all Key Stage 2 children go swimming. <p><u>Sports Clubs</u></p> <p>Our school offers a range of after school sports clubs, accessed by children from Key Stages One and Two. <p><u>Girls Football</u></p> <p>At Budbrooke Primary we aim to inspire more girls to participate in sport. <p><u>The Playmakers Young Leaders Awards</u></p> <p>A select group of Year 5 Children to develop their leadership, communication and problem solving skills as well as having the opportunity to be fit, active and motivated. They will learn about teamwork, learn about sports coaching and become leaders of the future running sports sessions for Key Stage One classes.</p>	<p>£420</p>	<p>Support Sport</p>	<p>This will impact the whole school as the Young Leaders will have the opportunity to use their transferrable skills and leadership skills to benefit the rest of the school by running activities for different year groups.</p>
<p><u>Competitions.</u></p> <p>Children already have a lot of opportunities to represent the school in the football league, 5-a-side football competitions, cricket, netball and cross country competitions. The funding will be spent on taking part in an increased number of new competitions as part of the Sainsbury's Games. These will include a mixed football competition for Year 3/4, and for KS2 there will be competitions such as indoor athletics, Rounders, Modern Pentathlon and the Winter Games competitions.</p>	<p>£60 spent so far.</p>	<p>Sainsbury's Games in conjunction with Central Warwickshire School Sports Partnership</p>	<p>Children throughout the school will have access to a competitive sports challenge, team work, a competitive spirit and sportsmanship which will allow numerous children to represent the school, engage the local community as well as fostering good relationships with other schools.</p> <p>Recently we have won the Year 3/4 mix football tournament and we will be representing the county.
